- IV. Title I Program Evaluation – 6:06pm Updates on Title 1. There was a handout provided. An explanation was given as to what Title 1 funds are and how they are used, such as tutor support, literacy support, support staff provided and use of NWEA. 2,257 students completed NWEA and there has been a 650% increase of intervention services (such as Read 180). Information on LCAP was provided such as that the school has a 89.4% graduation rate, 0.02% suspension rate and a 91% success rate with students. LCAP goals are: 1) Increase academic progress 2) students will gain skills for college and career readiness 3) increase student retention 4) increase educational partners and engagement.
- V. Community Schools –LCAP Overview – 6:12pm. Adam Ramirez talked about the community schools team. The team desires support from the community. Grant writing is in progress. Some ideas for use of the grant include: Parent classes and better food. The team desires to know what the community wants from the grant.
