II. Approval of minutes of the previous ELAC meeting

Approval of previous minutes were completed. Memo Velasco made a motion to approve, and Raquel Goyenaga seconded the motion.

III. Understanding the English Learner Proficiency Assessment for California (ELPAC)

- a. Reclassification Procedures
Raquel Goyenaga explained reclassification process. This includes an overall level 4 on the ELPAC assessment. With Levels 3 or 4 in the subdomains. Minimum of 5 ELA/ELD Core credits with a C or better. NWEA Lexile of 850+ or ELA Smarter Balanced Standards Nearly met.
- b. ELPAC is a series of 4 tests containing: Initial ELPAC, Initial Alternate ELPAC
- c. Summative ELPAC Requirement: Must administer to all eligible students grades K-12
- d. Ages 3-21 Within Testing Window
- e. Primary Language other than English
- f. Have completed the Initial ELPAC and been identified as an EL
- g. School must complete 95% student testing participation

IV. Support and Criteria for Reclassification

- a. How EL Reclassification happens: Overall Score of 4 on ELPAC, 850 Lexile on NWEA, 5 English credits with a C or better on each credit.
- b. ELPAC: We completed testing 100% of our students withing 2 weeks of the testing window February 2nd - February 27th
- c. ELPAC Importance: Measures how well students understand English and gives information how teacher can support the students.

- d. NWEA, PFT, ELPAC, CAASPP, & CAST
- e. NWEA (Northwest Evaluation Association, Local test to help us assist our students to progress academically twice a year, Spring Window April 18th to May 11th)
- f. PFT (Physical Fitness Test State Test February 2nd to 27th)
- g. ELPAC Testing from February 1st – May 31st
- h. CAASPP For grade 11 students and the window is March 23 through May 8th
- i. CAST for students

III. Review of the CSI Plan:

Alta Vista is identified as a CSI (Comprehensive School Improvement School) because our 4-year graduation rate is below the target. That means we need your input to develop a plan that improves student achievement. This school year, we utilized tutoring to help support our students and increase credit completion and graduation rate. We will now do a short activity where you will give input on areas you believe are important for us to focus on this next school year.

Leah Jones discussed over what ELPAC requirements that 15 student tested so far Samantha Perez reclassified. 100% reclassification rate

V. Supports and Criteria for Reclassification

Leah Jones reviewed the current reclassification window, which will close on June 30. She shared the latest reclassification percentages and recognized students who recently reclassified with certificates and acknowledgments. To reclassify, students must score at Level Four on the ELPAC and earn a grade of C or higher in English. Parent participation and attendance support are highly encouraged, especially as students return to school before June 30.

VI. State Testing Window

Vanessa Turner indicated that the testing season has commenced. We have completed the PFT, begun NWEA and ELPAC assessments, and will soon start CAASP and CAST.

VII. CTE and Dual Enrollment Updates

Sylvia Souza discussed the Dual Enrollment and CTE programs currently accepting applications for the summer session, open from June to July. EMT classes are available for fall, and a Business class is offered at another site.

VIII. California Community Schools Partnership Program (CCSPP) Grant Updates

Hayley Mallozzi discussed the Community School Grant, which provided \$500,000 for this school year. The funds are allocated for staff employment, emergency supplies, events, development of community spaces, murals, and expanded learning opportunities.
